In times of distress, feeding the doll a morsel of food or a drop to drink will bring it to life as a loyal ally. Each of the puzzles will yield three answers, one of which will be an item of food or drink. Present that to the doll and it may give you some sage advice. Verify other answers via the Answer Check link.

If you keep your wits about you, you may be able to determine an incantation or ward that will break Baba Yaga's spell on you; that's the final answer to this set of puzzles.

Baba Yaga's yard, surrounded by a fence made of bones, is badly in need of straightening up. But with all the enchantments surrounding it, exactly how you're supposed to do that is something of a mystery.

Baba Yaga flies in a huge iron **mortar and pestle**. Left on its own, the infernal object grinds things up maliciously. For six pairs of crossing entries in the grid, the letters from the two answers must be ground up together and redistributed into two new entries to be entered in place of the originals (these entries will include a proper name and two two-word nouns). Read the Nth letter of the Nth clue whose entry is affected by the mortar and pestle for a message revealing where to find one answer.

Baba Yaga's **hut** runs about madly on giant chicken legs. Unless affected by the mortar as well, entries affected by the hut are to be entered normally, with the inevitable resulting collisions allowing you to track its movements through the yard. Read the Nth letter of the Nth clue whose entry is affected by the hut for a message revealing where to find another answer.

Treating clues for unaffected entries as a third set might also prove useful.
